### Australian Lamb and Wool Outlook Promising.

Australian agriculture entered 2007 in difficult circumstances, with a severe drought gripping the country. Although most areas have now received some useful rains the drought, for many, and the effects are far from over.

However, the global and local economies remain strong, providing solid support for demand growth. Demand for Australian lamb remained strong in both the Australian and overseas markets in 2006. The domestic market continues to be the largest single market for Australian lamb. This strength in demand is set to continue, with domestic consumption expected to remain steady throughout 2007.

Global demand for lamb has also been strong, with increased exports to a number of markets in 2006. The US is Australia's largest export market for lamb, making up 27.1% of total exports for 2006. This was a slight easing on 2005, but still the second highest on record.

US consumers do not eat lamb on a regular basis. In fact, 80% of consumers claimed that they had never even tried lamb. In order to increase the awareness and consumption of lamb, Australia, New Zealand and the US have agreed to a jointly funded lamb campaign in the US. A successful campaign could lead to large increases in the demand for lamb.

The rise in Australian lamb exports to Japan has been impressive. As at the end of November 2006, Japan was

Australia's second largest export market for lamb and reached record levels in 2006.

The Japanese lamb boom has showed no signs of ending, with demand expected to remain strong throughout 2007.

The outlook for lamb remains positive, with global demand expected to remain strong. Lower lambing due to drought will continue to impact, with production likely to struggle to reach the 2006 record.

We have recently seen a welcome improvement in wool prices. Prices have responded to both concerns over declining Australian production and signs of demand growth in a number of export markets, including Asia and Europe, due to low pipeline stock levels and strong retail sales.

Australian Wool Innovation (AWI) has forecast wool production in Australia to fall to a 20 year low, 9% below 2005/06 levels.

The recent recovery in wool prices is a welcome change of fortune for an industry that has been in steady decline for over a decade.

The Dohne is the one sheep breed in Australia to take full advantage of both the lamb and wool markets. Acknowledgement – Rabobank Global Focus

#### **Stud History**

Macquarie Dohne Stud was registered in 1999 with a 50% share of the first Dohne embryos imported into eastern Australia. Since then, large scale embryo transfer programmes have enabled Macquarie to become one of the largest and most genetically diverse Dohne studs in Australia with 1500 registered purebred stud breeding ewes. Macquarie sold 400 rams in 2006 to all eastern states of Australia from Tasmania to Hughenden in QLD.

Macquarie genetics have influenced major Dohne studs in NSW, Victoria and Western Australia through semen, ram and embryo sales. Macquarie has over 500 rams for sale in 2007 giving clients a large and diverse selection.

Macquarie has undoubtedly the most successful sale history of any Dohne stud in Australia:

- Top priced ram at the National Sale 5 years in a row (02&06).
- Australian record at auction twice \$16,000- 2003 and 20,000- 2004.

The discontinuation of mulesing beyond 31<sup>st</sup> December 2010 is now a reality.

A high percentage of Dohnes have a natural bare

breech. At Macquarie we are

following the bare breech guidelines set down by AWI. This will not be to the detriment of other major characteristics but will have a positive flow-on effect to our client's flocks.

#### A meat and wool 'factory'

Innovative farmers Wayne and Sally Hawkins Circle H Farms 'Glenvarloch', Francis S.A, have a blue print for the future and are well along the road already. They realised early that as wool prices plummeted, so

did their viability. 'Being traditional merino breeders, we made a management decision to change from principally wool producers to meat producers, by the introduction of the Dohne breed'.

As livestock manager Chris Jefferies explained, Circle H is running 17,500 ewes, comprising merino ewes, F1 and F2 Dohne ewes, first cross ewes, first cross lambs and Merino/Dohne cross ewe lambs.

'Livestock production is targeted at producing prime lambs' Chris said.

'We have the ability to finish lambs in a 6000-head capacity feedlot.'

'We sell the tops of our lambs out of the paddock in the spring with the balance going into the feedlot,' Chris said.

'Two years ago all our merino ewes were mated to Border Leicester rams. The best of the ewe lambs were kept as replacements and joined to Poll Dorset and White Suffolk rams.'

Replacement merino ewes had to be purchased, but this created problems, Chris said.

'With the difficulty of purchasing good young merino ewes and the disease risk, we looked at breeding our own replacement ewes that combined meat, wool, frame and high lambing rates,' he said.

'To this end we trailed Dohne, SAMM (South African Mutton Merino) and AMM (Australian Meat Merino) using semen from proven sires, over big, plain-bodied Merino ewes.'

The results of this trial led Circle H down the Dohne path.

'With such high lambing percentages, in time we will be able to sell ewes at four and five years of age for good money to prime lamb producers.'

Out of a total 8700 merino ewes, 6500 have been mated to Dohne rams. There are also 1000 F1 and F2 Dohne ewes.

The whole operation is gearing itself for prime lamb production, by way of that dual-purpose meat and wool factory, the Dohne.

'Return per hectare is what viable farming is all about.' Chris said.

'It is all very exciting and we are keen to get there yesterday.'
