
DUAL PURPOSE BREEDS - A FAD?

Recent publications from heavy weight sheep industry analysts such as **Rabobank** and **Meat and Livestock Australia** have pointed to the fact that Dual Purpose Breeds offer the Australian Sheep Industry a very profitable pathway for both individual breeders and the sheep industry as a whole, both now and into the foreseeable future.

In its **Global Focus - Sheep** report, **Rabobank** makes the point that:

"Profitability of sheep production has improved significantly in recent years after the difficult decade of the 1990's. However, the flock remains delicately balanced, particularly in relation to the availability of the cornerstone of the wool and meat industry - the merino ewe".


"Australian sheep numbers have been in long-term decline, due to sustained low wool prices and a reduction in the relative profitability of wool production compared with other enterprises".

"The emergence of a professional and profitable prime lamb industry has altered the composition of the flock away from the merino towards meat-based breeds, and wool has become a by-product of meat production".

"With higher lamb prices and lower wool prices in the past 18 months, operators have begun to derive a higher proportion of their income receipts from stock turnoff rather than their wool clip. Dual purpose operators are currently in a better position, as they benefit from higher lamb prices and from any gradual recovery in wool returns".

"The Dohne allows merino breeders to continue in a self replacing quality wool enterprise while benefiting from the increased profitability of the sheepmeat industry by way of increased lambing rates, growth rates and carcass value".

MACQUARIE CLIENT SUCCESSES

After receiving prime lamb rates over the hook in recent years, the Dohne is now recognised by meat buyers and agents alike as a leading prime lamb breed and is commanding premium prices in the saleyards throughout NSW.

Following are some sale results from clients of Macquarie Dohnes:

- Alex Druce of 'Paringa', Warren topped the Dubbo Prime Lamb Market on the 21st June, 2004 with 11 and 12 month old F1 wether lambs, selling for \$155 per head or c. 478c/ kg dressed. These lambs were all sired by Macquarie rams.
- The Cosgrove family of 'Mylone', Warren sold 11 month old F1 and F2 lambs for \$140.50 per head. These lambs were estimated to weigh 58.5kg live.
- Bill and Margie Pye of 'Calga', Coonamble sold 8/9 month old lambs for \$117 per head. These lambs were estimated to weigh 23kg dressed.
- Barry and Veronica Beach of 'Yarrandale', Warren sold a draft of F1 wethers that had experienced an extremely tough start for \$135 per head.
- Rose Hill Pastoral Co., Gurley sold 11 month F1 and F2 wethers for \$138. These lambs were weighed onto Currawong grazing wheat and weighed off after 26 days. The F2 lambs put on up to 500grms per head per day with the average for both F1 and F2 lambs being 430 grams per head per day.
- Grant and Ron Masters of 'Fernleigh', Spicers Creek sold F1 wether lambs (estimated 52kg live) for \$128.
- Carinya Pastoral Co., Ballimore sold 180 2y.o F1 ewes off shears in November 2003 for \$147.50 per head.

DOHNE FERTILITY

- Bill and Margie Pye of 'Calga', Coonamble joined 2004 merino ewes on the 1st October 2003 to 1% Dohne rams for 6 weeks. These ewes were scanned in early January 2004 resulting in 193 dry ewes or 9.6%. 1609 ewes had 100% lambs weaned off them during the first week in September 2003. Some of these rams were under 12 months of age.
- Chris Carrigan of 'Welbon', Garah had CFA ewes rear 118% lambs during the drought in 2003. Chris has sourced top quality AA and A rams, mostly at auction. Chris equated the number and cost of rams to lambs weaned over a conservative 4 year working life of a ram. The cost per lamb weaned was under \$4 per head.
- Kim and Wendy Muffet of 'Taroona', Wirrinya joined F1 ewes at 10 months of age for an 87% conception.
- Alex Druce of 'Paringa', Warren joined at 1% and marked 94% lambs in 2004. These ewes were joined during the heat wave in February.
- David and Virginia Taylor of 'Glenidyl', Coonamble joined at just over 1% in November 2003 and marked 105%.

NB. Whilst many people are joining rams at 1% it must be realised that at this rate there is little back up if 1 or more rams are "off" during the joining period. 1% is sufficient if the seasonal conditions are favourable and if pre-joining ram and ewe management is appropriate. The principals of Macquarie Dohne Stud recommend joining at 1.5% to cover any potential problems during joining.

2004 SALE RAMS

Macquarie sale rams are grown out under natural grazing conditions. No irrigation or forced feeding has taken place. Whilst rams may be finished prior to sale, we are aiming to breed an animal capable of reaching its genetic potential under natural conditions.

Once again this year's sale rams have gone through a torrid time, being hand fed through the drought from weaning in November to June this year. However, despite this we are happy with their type, conformation, growth' and wool quality.

This year's sale rams have an average micron of 18.1, average C.V of 17.7 and an average C.F of 99.

Flock rams will be available for private treaty from Monday 1st November 2004.

Preference is given to those clients who don't fill their ram requirements at the upcoming auction sales and then on a 'first in, first served' basis.

GENETIC DIVERSITY

The principals of Macquarie are conscious of the importance of genetic diversity, especially when large scale embryo transfer programs are used.

In 2003 Macquarie purchased 3 sires and used 11 sires for joining in 2004.

An extensive embryo transfer program and A.I, earlier this year, will result in 1300 lambs being born this year.

INFORMATION DAYS


